**4-H Arts Leadership Lab: Building Leadership through Performing and Visual Arts**

***New this year, the 4-H Arts Leadership Lab will be conducted at the State Fair Park Youth Center in Milwaukee. Come join us as we take advantage of the wide variety of cultural and artistic opportunities available to us at this new location! This year's Lab will feature an included trip to the historic Pabst Theatre in downtown Milwaukee to see the Milwaukee Repertory Theatre's performance of "A Christmas Carol"!***

The Arts Leadership Lab for new and emerging leaders is open to adults and youth leaders in high school who are interested in leading activities in their clubs and organizations. Participants develop a plan of action to carry out in their local areas. County teams of teens and adults are encouraged to attend. Workshop tracks include communication, music, photography, theatre arts, video, and visual arts. The sessions of all the workshops will include the general principles of leadership, program planning, and practical application. In addition, all participants are involved in large group arts activities. Registration forms are due in the County UW-Extension Office by November 1<sup>st</sup>.

All county registrations must be authorized and sent to the State 4-H Office by November 1. Counties may register six (6) participants per county. Additional registrants will be accepted as space permits. Everyone on the waiting list will be contacted regarding their status by November 15. This program, sponsored by 4-H, is open to leaders from any youth organization. Mid-November participants will receive a packet of information about the weekend. It will include a health and expectation form, map, planning form, and list of useful items.

NOTE: Refunds will be given for legitimate reasons if the State 4-H Office is given 24 hours notice. No refunds will be issued for no-shows.

Auditions for the State 4-H Drama Company and the 4-H Showcase Singers will be conducted at 7:00 pm on Saturday, December 3<sup>rd</sup>.

**Communications Track:** Talking or listening? Reading or writing? Shoulder shrugging or grimacing? From word-working to speaking, from interviewing to performing, from group interaction to body language, come learn, experiment, and communicate. Get ready for some hands-on fun based on the popular *4-H Building Bridges* activities.

In the **Music Workshop Track:** Participants will enjoy a variety of musical experiences useful in club, organization, and camp activities. You will learn about techniques and resource that can help in preparing for musical festivals.

In the **Photography Track** you will be introduced to digital imaging using computers and digital cameras. As a participant you will use a digital camera to produce pictures and learn the differences and similarities of conventional and digital photography. Cameras will be provided. Enrollment is limited to 12.

In the **Theatre Arts Track** participants will learn theatre arts and drama activities from the 4-H Theatre Arts Adventures curriculum. Activities for youth ages 5-18 in acting, mime, movement, puppetry, technical theatre (costumes, makeup, lights and sets) will be shared. Participants will have the fun of making drama while learning what leading drama is all about.

Create a **Video!** This track will focus on basic video techniques and production. Use your experience in the arts to produce a video short. Bring your own camcorder! (optional, but preferred)

As **Visual Arts Track** participants, you will learn how to lead arts and crafts activities while you enjoy making art. The many exciting art activities include some from the new visual arts resource, Palette of Fun. You are encouraged to bring a portfolio of your own artwork to share.
