Curling Iron Caddy

Materials:

- 18" square fabric, any type *
- 9" x 14" piece of teflon fabric

* Use quilted fabric OR

Use non-quilted fabric and fleece

Techniques:

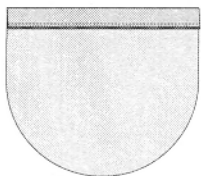
- Stitching around curves
- Seam finishing
- Turning under a hem
- Pressing
- Working with multiple layers of fabric

Equipment:

- Sewing machine

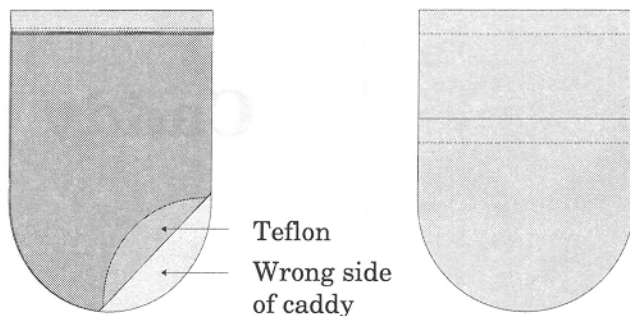
Directions:

1. Prewash fabric.
2. Cut one piece 9" x 14" for the caddy. Cut teflon fabric 9" x 12-1/2" to line the caddy. If fleece is used, cut one piece 9" x 13".
3. Cut one piece 9" x 9" for the pocket. (If only a 1/2 pocket is used, cut one piece 4-1/2" x 9".)
4. Cut rounded corners on the lower edge of the cut fabric.
5. Zigzag top edge of pocket and caddy to seam finish the edge and hold the quilted layers together.
6. Turn pocket top under 1" and top stitch.



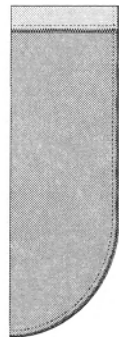
7. Pin teflon fabric to WRONG side of caddy. Turn caddy top under 1" and top stitch.

8. Position pocket wrong side down on right side of caddy and pin.



9. Fold caddy and pocket, right sides together, lining up cut edges.

10. Stitch using a 1/4" seam allowance. Stitch two stitches, backstitch, then stitch down side and along curve, backstitch at the end.



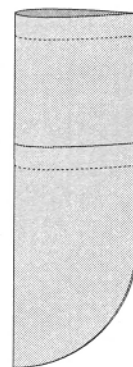
11. Set the machine for a small zigzag stitch. Zigzag next to the stitching line in the seam allowance. This is the seam finish.

12. Trim any excess seam allowance away without cutting the machine stitches.

13. Press the seam.

14. Turn the caddy to the right side and press.

15. Your caddy is finished. The curling iron fits in the teflon lined caddy and the electrical cord fits in the pocket.



16. Enjoy using your caddy on trips or at home.
